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Combined #winter and #COVID-19 pressures make it ever more important to promote and embed self care behaviour, helping to reduce unnecessary demand from self-treatable conditions in NHS primary and urgent care settings.

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Recommendation 1 (a central self care hub on NHS.uk)

A new audit of online self care information across NHS platforms highlights the need for a central hub for self care, signposted from all #NHS providers and #NHS111 online.

Recommendation 2 (review and roll out of self care apps)

NHS Apps library should review and roll out #selfcare apps. @PAGBselfcare digital audit identified a need for apps on self-treatable conditions and minor ailments.

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The NHS should review and roll out more self care apps through the apps library to widen access to #selfcare information.

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Recommendation 3 (online triage referral to self care when appropriate)

The COVID-19 pandemic has shown that digitisation of healthcare services can happen at pace and scale when required. #NHS systems should ensure they effectively support people to self care. #digitalhealth #SelfCare #SelfCareWeek/ http://www.pagb.co.uk/policy/digital-self-care-audit
